Centenary Lecture Highlights Importance of Science and Technology in Everyday Living

The Department of Physics, IIT (ISM) Dhanbad, organised a Centenary Lecture on 27 November 2025 at the Golden Jubilee Lecture Theatre (GJLT), drawing enthusiastic participation from school students, research scholars and faculty members. The lecture, titled "Importance of Science and Technology in Daily Life," was delivered by Prof. Amit Kumar Agarwal of the Department of Physics, IIT Kanpur, recipient of the Rashtriya Vigyan Puraskar – Vigyan Yuva–Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar Award 2025.

The programme commenced with a warm welcome address by Prof. R. Thangavel, Coordinator of the program, who highlighted the significance of fostering scientific curiosity among young minds and the department's commitment to centenary-year outreach initiatives.
