140 daily wage earners, who underwent job oriented training at Skill Development Centre of IIT (ISM) receive certificates today in presence of Shri PN Singh, Dhanbad MP and Shri Raj Sinha, Dhanbad MLA.

Altogether 140 daily wage earners of coal town and surrounding areas who underwent training at Skill Development Centre of IIT (ISM) received certificates at Penman Auditorium of the institute from the hands of dignitaries, including Shri PN Singh, Dhanabd MP and Shri Raj Sinha local MLA who graced the occasion as chief guest and guest of hour, respectively.

Prof Rajiv Shekhar, Director IIT (ISM) who presided over the function also distributed the certificates along with Prof Dhiraj Kumar, Deputy Director; Prabodh Pandey, Acting Registrar; Prof Alok Sinha, Dean (Infrastructure) to beneficiaries that included 78 certificates of Fundaments of Computer and Peripherals, 27 certificates of Mechanical skills (Machining), 8 of Mechanical Skills (Welding), 11 of Plumbing and 16 of Electrical skills.

Speaking during the occasion, Shri PN Singh lauded the initiative taken by IIT (ISM) to provide job oriented training to daily wage earners and other needy people at IIT (ISM) by setting up Skill development Centre and said "the training conducted at IIT (ISM) and certificates provided today after the completion of training assumes special significance for the beneficiaries that included trainees of four batches of computer and two batches of four other streams".

Notably, the training for the daily wage earners of Dhanbad, Jharia and surrounding areas with the aim improving their employability as well as for establishing self enterprise ventures began at the skill development Centre of IIT (ISM) Dhanbad on November 11,2021 under the guidance of director, Prof Rajiv Shekhar and so far training has been provided to four batches.

The training, that included, both Theory and Practical training is carried out on Saturday-Sunday and is of total 30 hours.

The objective behind launching of SDC is to develop skilled manpower that can contribute to the Economic Growth of the nation.

Notably, IIT (ISM) has launched first computer awareness programme for the needy persons surrounding areas of the institutes and especially it's five adopted villages including Dhaiya, Lahbani, Bhelatand, Bapunagar and Mandal Basti from June 25 to June 28,2018.
