51 students of two different schools visit IIT (ISM) laboratories under K-12 Outreach Programme.

Altogether 51 students of two schools, including 26 of Lions Public School, Sindri and 25 of Holy Mother's Academy, Pradhankhanta today underwent a hands on training in robotics, animation, mining technology innovation in the state of art laboratories of IIT (ISM).

The occasion was the seventh edition of Laboratory Visit for school students organized by Media and Branding office of the institute under K-12 Outreach programme, which aims of inspire and equip the school students to pursue career in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

The visitors also explored the facilities at CIL innovation and Incubation Centre and later visited Atal Community Innovation Centre (ACIC), situated in I2h building where they witnessed the ground breaking innovations being carried out under the aegis of different start-ups.
