## Training Program on ethics and governance at IIT (ISM) as part of vigilance Awareness Week.

A training program on ethics and governance was conducted today at the Golden Theatre of IIT (ISM) Dhanbad by the CVO Office of the institute, during which Shri PK Jha, Superintendent of Police, Anti-Corruption Bureau, CBI, Dhanbad, provided tips to the participants that included the officers, staff, and faculty members to help them explore the principles of the organization's commitments to transparency, fairness, and public trust.
