Youths of Jharkhand and Uttarkhand explore the lush green beauty, rich cultural heritage, wild life and architectural marvels of Jharkhand and Uttarakhand as part of Yuva Sangam under the Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Abhiyan of the Ministry of Education

The lush green beauty of scenic locales of Jharkhand and Uttarakhand, the rich cultural heritage of the two states, the unique dance forms, and architectural marvels of both the states dating back to Gupta and Maurya Dynasty will be explored by the youths of both the states during November and December as part of a Cultural Exchange Program being organized by IIT (ISM) Dhanbad in association with IIT Roorkee as Phase V of Yuva Sangam under the Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Abhiyan of the Ministry of Education.

The one Cultural Exchange Program, Yuva Sangam, for which UG, PG, and Off Campus Youth (NCC/NSS/Sports/Arts and Culture) students of the age group of 18 to 33 can register by clicking on the link <https://lnkd.in/d623jgDB>. Till October 21, 2024, will also provide the opportunity to the participants to explore the cuisine, folk traditions, festivals, and unique tribal art and traditions of both Jharkhand and Uttarkhand, both of which are endowed with natural beauty.

The Yuva Sangam, which will cover multi-dimensional experience, including tourism, traditions, development, people-to-people contact, and technology, will also provide the unique experience to the participating youths to explore the forests, a large number of falls like Dasam, Jonha, Hundru, Usri, Hirni falls of Jharkhand and Neergarh, Kempty, Bhatta, Bhalu Garh, and Corbett falls of Uttarakhand, and national parks like Betla National Park, Palamau Tiger Reserve, Hazaribagh National Park, Koderma Wildlife Sanctuary of Jharkhand and Gangotri National Park, Govind Pashu National Park, Jim Corbett National Park, and Corbett Tiger Reserve.

The cultural exchange will also provide the opportunity for the visitors to explore the old forts and new forts of both the states, including Palamu Fort, Naryanpur Fort, Bishrampur Fort, Rohila Fort, etc., of Jharkhand, and other forts of Uttarkhand, including Chandpur Fort, Kunja Puri Fort, Nag Tibaa Fort, and Nalagarh Fort.

The youth during the cultural exchange program, which will be free of charge, will also explore the snow-covered mountain peaks of Uttarkhand, including Nanda Devi, Badrinath, and Kamet, and also the hill stations of Jharkhand, including Parasnath Hills, Netarhar, Tagore Hill, Canary Hill, and Dhvajadhari Hill of Jharkhand.

The famous temples of both the states include Naina Devi Temple, Badrinath Temple, Kedarnath Temple of Uttarkhand, Baidyanath Dham Temple, Parasnath Temples, etc. of Jharkhand.
